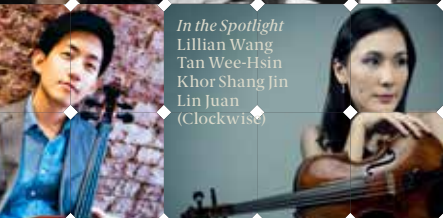
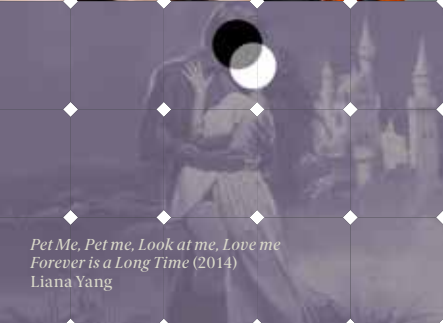

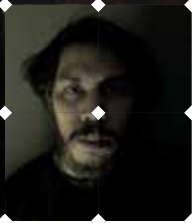

## The Arts House presents Marina Budhos Fiction and the Migrants in Us

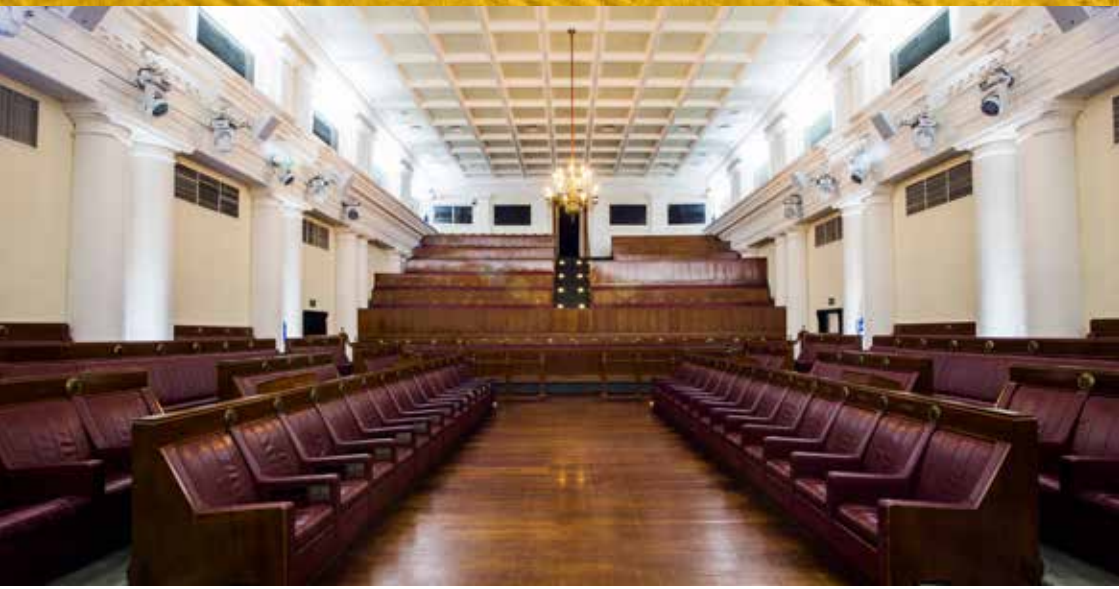
